## **Solar Project Update**

At the August 15th Board of Education meeting, an update on the district's solar project was presented. For several years, the Board has been pursuing the concept of construction of solar panels to help provide for savings in the District's operational costs, as well as help support the development of sustainable energy sources and green efforts.

Within the scope of this energy savings performance contract, the Board currently has provided direction to Performance Systems Inc, to perform the engineering stage of the project design, which will help put more specific parameters on the development of a ground-mount solar



field on the south end of the Almond Campus property. The engineering phase of the planning work should also help the district in the development of a timeline for the project.

# Recap of August 21, 2018 Board of Education Meeting

The Board of Education had their monthly business meeting at the O'Plaine Campus in the Library Media Center. This venue provided an opportunity for the Board members and others present at the meeting to tour the building and see the renovation projects that took place over the summer months.

The Board recognized José Zires, Director of Facilities and the Building and Grounds staff for their outstanding contributions to the projects and renovations during the summer of 2018 and their efforts to have the buildings ready for students and staff.

Assistant Superintendent of Instructional Services Chris Geocaris, provided two reports: one report about Grants and Funding programs for our staff and students. The second report was related to the Alternative Learning Opportunities Program (ALOP) which provides opportunities for our at-risk students.

Dr. Ahlgrim provided an update on the solar project.

The Board approved the following items:

- Hiring recommendations for 27 employees and prospective candidates
- Payment of bills in the amount of \$2,325,842.77, which includes payroll and expenditures
- Regular and Executive Session minutes of July 17, 2018
- A Resolution for the Preparation of the Tentative Budget for 2018-2019
- A Resolution for the Treasurer to Participate in the Illinois School District Liquid Asset Fund (ISDLAF)

The next Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 11, 2018 beginning at 5:45 p.m. in the Board Conference Room at the District Office. This will be a short business meeting concluding at 6:30 p.m. which will immediately be followed by the 2018 Strategic Planning Committee meeting in the Almond Campus Library. Both meeting rooms are located at 34090 N. Almond Road, Gurnee.




## **Back to School Community Fun**

## **Professional Development**



On August 8th, our district leadership team met for a retreat to discuss organizational goals for the year. Our professional development in the district this year will focus on *Design*. The entire staff was also introduced to this focus during the Institute

days on August 13 and 14, and over the course of this year we will be learning strategies to design meaningful and impactful learning experiences for our students.

# Diversity Presentation – Setting The Tone For a Culturally Responsive Classroom

During the opening institute day, the entire staff participated in a presentation by Roger Moreano of Bridges Consulting LLC, regarding our diversity efforts at WTHS and building an inclusive community.

#### Instructional Services

Our instructional coaches provide professional development for our staff in formal and informal settings. They work individually with teachers as well as hold Lunch and Learns and organize collaborative activities for staff. Our Instructional Coaches are hosting their first Lunch and Learn this month which will focus on *Designing* a positive learning environment in our classrooms.

## **Educational Technology**

Our Educational Technology department had a very busy summer, and were able to implement some important updates to the technology infrastructure in our district. Two Business computer labs at the Almond



Canvas continues to be an integral part of the educational experience here at Warren. After six days of classes, students have viewed over 42,000 pages in Canvas!

Campus and the Foreign Language computer labs at O'Plaine and Almond all received brand new computers for students to use.

We also updated our school security camera system this summer. This updated system provides improved camera images, more efficient transfer of data on our network, and allows our administration and school resource officers to more easily view footage, and will provide improved monitoring of the interiors and exteriors of both campuses. We are very excited to have implemented this important school safety measure.

#### In The Classroom



Introduction to Piano classes are utilizing a new instructional design to make the course more meaningful for students. The students use their Chromebooks to access lesson(s) to work on for the day. This enables the students to review lessons at their own pace, get extra help from the teacher, and move ahead when they are ready. Students take a series of assessments to ensure that they attain a skill standard before moving on to the next lesson. The students and teachers have really enjoyed this change in the curriculum!



The Tech Academy+ Program has opened for the year. Our students are already hard at work repairing Chromebooks and earning technology certifications! These students along with our summer student workers, Tech Academy+ teachers, and Educational Technology Department staff are a large part of why our 1 to 1 Chromebook program has been so successful. Thank you to all of our students and staff at O'Plaine and Almond who participate in this program!

## **News From Business Services and Operations**

### **FY19 Tentative Budget**

The budget process typically starts in January and continues through August. The fiscal year 2019 budget was developed using historical data, actuals, requests from departments, and input from the administration in a collaborative effort. The use of all of these methods helps ensure that a well thought out and collaborative budget is created. Multiple stakeholders have input into this year's budget. The budget is an estimate or our best educated guess on what will happen over the course of the next year. The budget should be used for planning and guiding budgetary decisions throughout the year.



This year's current tentative budget has an estimated revenue across all funds at \$69,434,699 and expenditures across all funds at \$68,963,350. The budget is currently on public display at the District Office. The Board of Education is scheduled to adopt the budget on September 25, 2018 at the regularly scheduled board meeting.

#### **FY18 Annual Audit**

The Business Office staff generally begin preparing for the annual audit in June. The staff has been very busy gathering documentation and preparing for the audit for the past several weeks.

The audit helps ensure that the District is staying on track and using proper account coding and aligning accounting practices with both state and federal guidelines. The audit also helps ensure that the District is using best practices throughout the year.





