Ultimately, the Governor of Illinois declared stay-at-home orders and closed schools from March 17 through March 30 as an initial means to ensure social distancing to help limit exposure to the virus. Schools were allowed to open March 31, only under remote learning status, with students and staff staying at home and continuing the educational process remotely. We will continue with eLearning through at least April 30.

# **Board of Education News**

The safety, health and wellness of our students and staff is our highest priority. The governor and the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) have been providing directives regarding school closures and/or remote learning for the past month. All schools were officially closed from March 17 through March 30. Governor Pritzker announced mandatory stay-at-home procedures for all Illinoisans to help slow the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19). For WTHS, this meant that in-person instruction was suspended beginning March 31 originally through April 7, and then extended through April 30 and possibly longer.

On behalf of Warren Township High School, thank you to everyone who has embraced the eLearning process to help us during this unprecedented situation the coronavirus has brought to our community. Our teachers, staff



and administrators put together a comprehensive plan to work with our students through creative and innovative remote lessons. Our students stepped up to the plate and have been diligently completing their lessons and moving their education forward with daily coursework. Our parents and families created spaces at home for their students to complete day-to-day assignments and provide encouragement to keep their students on task. Our community has worked together to stay at home and help prevent spreading this virus. Additionally, our administrators have developed a program to provide meals and technology support for our families, while our custodial staff has thoroughly cleaned our buildings. Thank you all for working together during this challenging time so that our students continue to learn and grow.

#### **Board Meeting Updates**

Shortly following the stay-at-home order by the governor in March, the state legislature also made some quick, temporary changes to state statutes regarding the Open Meetings Act (OMA) and how public meetings (including those by our District 121 Board of Education) can be conducted. Specifically, the changes to the OMA allow individuals to participate remotely in public meetings. Prior to the changes, board members could participate remotely provided some conditions of their absence, and it provided a quorum if other members were physically present at the meetings. During the current stay-at-home order, members are allowed to participate remotely without the need for physical attendance at meetings.

Public participation is mandated for all public meetings, including our Board of Education meetings. This participation can also be allowed and expected to be conducted remotely. For upcoming board meetings, the process for remote public participation during the normal specified timeframes at our meetings will be provided, along with the required normal posting of the meeting. The meetings themselves will also be livestreamed as required by these temporary adjustments to the Open Meetings Act.

#### **End of Year WTHS Events**

The coronavirus epidemic and subsequent suspension from in-school activities has unfortunately also caused WTHS to cancel or reschedule several end-of-the-year events. Below are cancellations or postponements that were communicated earlier this month. We will continue to communicate with district families regarding any further cancellations and/or postponements.

- All school events scheduled prior to May 4 are cancelled.
- Co-curricular/athletics: To be determined by the Illinois High School Association. Please see page 9 of the newsletter for more details.
- Cum Laude Recognition Night is cancelled.
- Senior Awards and Scholarship Night is cancelled.
- Prom (May 9, 2020) is cancelled.
- Prom is tentatively rescheduled for July 10, 2020, at the Almond Campus.
- Graduation: May 17, 2020 (if we are allowed back in school May 1).
- Graduation: Tentative alternative date set for July 12, 2020 (if eLearning extends beyond April 30).



As much as we would like to be back with students and staff at WTHS, the well-being of everyone is our highest priority and we want all our students and staff at home, safe and well with families. We all need to work together to minimize exposure to the virus and do our part to overcome this challenge.

For our students in the community, one thing you can gain from this pandemic is that this is truly a unique time in our history. The common referral to the COVID-19 and the subsequent medical response as "unprecedented" is certainly valid. In any new situation, society has an opportunity to learn and become better informed.

Specifically, I believe we all have a greater appreciation for the incredible commitment made each and every day by first responders and health care workers. We have seen the economic and social impacts of this temporary shutdown on our business world, and the incredible subsequent calls of generosity providing personal assistance to the many people who are impacted.

Finally, we have been encouraged to isolate with just our family units for an extended period during this stay-at-home order. # **News from Instructional Services**

Our Instructional Services team has worked collaboratively with our teachers, other school districts and the State of Illinois to put together an extended eLearning Program for our students that will continue to provide meaningful educational experiences until we are able to meet again in person. Our plan is designed to allow students the flexibility to complete work when they are able, as well as continue to provide options for direct instruction mixed with instruction delivered through a variety of technology-based strategies.

Our staff has risen to this challenge and developed video blogs and implemented innovative lessons that incorporate interactive online content. They also have found new ways to interact with and support their students in their learning.



While we miss seeing our students every day, we are doing our best to support them in this period of extended elearning.



I also want to recognize our Educational Technology Department. They have worked diligently over the past month to ensure our systems are stable and to implement processes to ensure students can receive technology support from a distance.

Our Technology Department has established a help desk system to communicate with students who require technical support, including the repair of malfunctioning school-issued Chromebooks. The student help desk system is available on our home page on our website, or by clicking here.



We are, of course, incredibly proud of our students for such a strong start to eLearning! # Testing Information for the 2019-2020 School Year

Due to the extended school closure, the State of Illinois has suspended all state testing for this spring. The PSAT9 for freshmen, PSAT10 for sophomores, SAT for juniors and the Dynamic Learning Maps Alternate Assessment (DLM) test are all postponed for this year. We are waiting for further information from the state as to the potential of offering the SAT in the fall. We will communicate additional information regarding the SAT suite of assessments as we learn more.

# **Basic Netiquette Guidelines**

#### **BE RESPECTFUL**

Treat everyone with kindness and respect. Please remember there are other people—with thoughts and feelings—who are viewing your communication. Use the same standards for your communication online as you do in a face-to-face setting. Think before you click send!

#### **BE FOCUSED**

There are limitless distractions when you're engaged in online learning. It may help to tell yourself that you are going to sit and focus for a certain amount of time, after which you will allow yourself to take a break. You'll be amazed how much easier it is to concentrate!

#### **BE PRODUCTIVE**

Remember, even though our school buildings are closed, *school* is still in session. You have a responsibility to engage in your school work and continue making progress on your learning. Communicate to the best of your ability using the skills (writing, speaking, presenting) you've learned in school. Challenge yourself to learn something new each day.

#### **BE SAFE**

Do not post personal information online about yourself or anyone else. This includes addresses, phone numbers, social media account handles, ages, and workplaces. Keep in mind that even if you delete something you posted, it can still live online permanently.

#### **BE RESPONSIBLE**

Whenever you are sharing something that originated from someone else, (video, picture, words, music, sounds) it is good practice to cite that source. This applies to discussion forums too. If you read a great thought, share it, but be sure you let your audience know where you saw it first.

#### **Prom Update**

Holding prom on May 9 is no longer a realistic option for us. The event has been canceled. However, we know this is an important event for our students. We are hopeful we can have prom later this summer at the Almond Campus and have a tentative date set for Friday, July 10.

This dance would follow a similar format of our homecoming dance, as a result of the current difficulty of finding vendors to provide the same experience as an off-site location. In addition, this event will only be for current WTHS (junior and senior) students. No outside guests will be allowed unless they are O'Plaine students. That said, we are still following public health and CDC guidelines, which may impact our ability to host the event.

Please keep in mind that planning and executing this event for typically over 1,000 students will be challenging given the current uncertainty. We will continue to do our best.

# Illinois High School Association (IHSA) and Spring Sports

The IHSA has provided the following statement regarding the status of the spring athletic season:

#### IHSA COVID-19 Update

\* Last updated at 2:30 pm on Wednesday, April 1, 2020

First and foremost, the IHSA continues to encourage all Illinois residents to heed the recommendations of state officials and medical experts. of state officials and medical experts. These quarantine and social distancing measures have been put in place not only for your own safety, but also for those around you. By adhering to them, we ensure the shortest path to returning to normalcy, including physical school attendance and participation in high school sports and activities.

Even though Illinois schools will remain closed through April 30th following the March 31st announcement by Illinois Governor JB Pritzker, we remain optimistic that a May 1 return to school, followed by a to-be-determined acclimatization practice period, can still result in a truncated spring season that culminates with IHSA State Series tournaments and the crowning of state champions in June.

In its discussions thus far, the IHSA Board of Directors has been highly supportive of creating an exemption to the IHSA Season Limitation By-law to allow spring sports to play into late June, but competing into or beyond July is not being considered at this time.

We are also realistic in recognizing that any further school postponements, or the cessation of physical school attendance for the remainder of the year, will almost certainly result in the cancellation of all remaining IHSA sports and activities this school year.

#### Athletic Participation Fee

Although we have postponed payment for our spring sport athletes, we are aware that many of you have already made payment for the spring season. We have been following the directives of the governor and the Illinois High School Association (IHSA) regarding the school closure through April 30, 2020. We will not be issuing any refunds until an official decision has been made to cancel IHSA spring athletics and activities.

#### Summer Camps

We are hopeful we will be able to host summer camps once the shelter-in-place order has been lifted. Registration for summer camps will not open until we have been given the appropriate directives.





Thank you to our coaches and activity sponsors for their patience, flexibility and creativity to stay connected with our students and families during this challenging time.
