Board of Education News

WTHS Referendum Update

After the April 2021 referendum question did not pass, the Board immediately began to investigate future options to help address the District's ongoing revenue challenges. At its meeting on June 22, 2021, the Warren Township High School District 121 Board of Education approved a plan to place a referendum question on the next available election ballot. It will most likely take place during the 2022 primary election.

WTHS anticipates the need to reduce approximately 13 more positions in March 2022. This is in addition to the 66 positions that have been eliminated over the past several years.

Along with these staff reductions, the district also plans to eliminate entry-level athletic teams for all sports beginning in fall 2022. Sports with four levels of participation will be reduced to three; sports with three levels will be reduced to two; and sports with two levels will be reduced to one. In each case, the entry-level team will be eliminated.

If the next referendum passes, the Board plans to allow the district to restore these entry-level teams, along with band programming for the start of the 2022-23 school, to the extent possible.

The District and Board look forward to engaging our community on these important issues over the next year.

Graduation Requirements

At its June 22, 2021 meeting, the Board of Education approved a recommendation for a reduction of the required graduation credits from 22.5 to 18.5, effective for the class of 2022 and beyond. The reduction is solely in the general electives requirement, which is reduced from 5.5 to 1.5 credits. Graduation requirements in all other disciplines are not impacted by this change. The new requirement of 18.5 credits is still higher than the 16 credits required by the state of Illinois. This reduction is based on several factors, including an analysis of struggling students over the last few years. The decreased overall credit requirements will also support students in their diploma acquisition.

Most students have traditionally earned credits well above our requirement. These students will have the same opportunity to do so at least for the next two years. The 18.5 threshold is also the target anticipated reduction that would occur as early as the 2023-24 school year if indeed the district needs to move to a seven-period school day (rather than our current eight-period day) due to financial challenges related to low funding.

If the district were to move to a seven-period school day, the new requirement of 18.5 credits for graduation would not need to be reduced further.

News from Instructional Services

This year, Warren was ranked 2,943rd nationally out of 37,100 public and private high schools in the country. This ranking puts Warren in the top 16% of schools earning the U.S. News Best High Schools designation — and in the top 8% of schools in the nation.

This has been an incredible year at WTHS. Our students continuously demonstrated their adaptability and resilience as we worked together as a community to navigate the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. Throughout the year, students worked hard to learn and grow as they explored their passions and developed critical skills that will serve them well throughout their lives. We are very proud of all our students have accomplished this year! We wish our graduates success and happiness as they move beyond the walls of Warren to their next adventure. We are excited to see our returning students in the fall, as we continue to grow and learn alongside all of you!

Warren Township High School Earns U.S. News Best High Schools Designation

Warren Township High School was notified in May that we again qualified as one of U.S. News' Best High Schools in the United States. The schools on this list are ranked based on college readiness of graduating seniors, math and reading proficiency, student performance in specific demographic subgroups, advanced coursework offerings, and 4-year graduation rate. This recognition is unique, as it measures how schools challenge their students academically rather than measuring solely on student test scores.



Scores from the April SAT administration are now available for students to view. Students can access their individual scores online through their College Board Account. We are proud of our students for putting forth a great effort!

During the month of May, our spring testing season drew to a close with the 2019 Advanced Placement Exam administration. AP Exams were administered from May 18 through May 28. This year, 1,107 students took 1,548 exams. Students will be able to access their scores through their College Board accounts on or around July 21.



These exams are the culminating activity at the end of months of hard work by our students. Our teachers worked hard to ensure their students were prepared. Thank you to all our AP teachers for going above and beyond to ensure students were fully prepared!

COVID Mitigation Modification for Student Athletes and Coaches

As of June 16, 2021, mitigations at the school have not changed in regards to masks, self-certification, and distancing. However, on June 11, the Illinois Department of Public Health and the Illinois State Board of Education have approved that vaccinated student athletes who are actively participating in summer camps/sports activities DO NOT have to wear a mask inside or outside of school buildings. This same rule applies to coaches and referees. We have communicated this information directly with parents and students who are involved in summer camps.

Required Grade 9 Physicals

To comply with Illinois School Code, Section 27-8, it is mandatory that all freshman students, students new to high school and transfer students who were not previously examined for ninth grade, have a physical examination and dental examination along with verification of the minimum immunizations on file before starting school.

Students will not be allowed to begin classes until the nurses have verified that the physical and immunization requirements have been met. Physicals and immunization records submitted after registration may delay the student's start date.

For incoming freshmen, any ninth-grade physical (not a sports physical) within one year prior to our first day of school on August 17, 2021 will be sufficient.

- Physicals and immunization records should be submitted before Thursday, July 29, 2021.
- A freshman physical will count for sports, but a sport physical will not be sufficient for the state requirements to attend school.
- Physicals and immunization records can be submitted by:
 - Uploading documents within the online registration forms
 - Emailing the nurse at O'Plaine Campus: onurse@wths.net
 - Faxing the documents to 847-599-4679
 - Dropping off the documents at the O'Plaine campus north entrance

Required Grade 12 Meningitis Vaccination

Vaccines for meningococcal disease have long been on the list of inoculations that the CDC recommends for adolescents, especially before they go to college. Effective January 1, 2015, all students entering the sixth and 12th grades are required to get the vaccination.

All students entering grade 12 will be required to show proof of recent meningococcal conjugate vaccination (MCV). All 12th graders who received their first dose prior to their 16th birthday must have a second dose on or after their 16th birthday. If receiving the first dose on or after their 16th birthday, only one dose is required. This vaccination will prevent your child from contracting a severe bacterial meningitis and other illnesses caused by this bacterium.

In addition to your healthcare provider, many local health departments and pharmacies offer the vaccine. The Illinois Department of Public Health recommends that parents get their adolescent vaccinated now to avoid a last-minute rush during the summer. Once you have obtained or verified that your child has been immunized with the Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine, please fax, e-mail or bring the information to the school nurse's office. We will enter the information into PowerSchool throughout the summer.

Students without adequate proof of the meningococcal vaccination will be subject to exclusion from school, beginning with the first day of attendance, until proof of immunization is reviewed by the nurse.

Thank you for your cooperation with this requirement. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call the health office at 847-548-6899.

Some students may have already received this vaccine, as it has been recommended for various populations in the past. In this case, all you would need to do is provide the school health office with verification of receiving the meningococcal conjugate vaccine. Documentation accepted as complying with the new state law requirement includes:

- A letter or note signed by your healthcare provider identifying the date the MCV was administered.
- A printout from your provider's electronic medical record (EMR) that indicates the vaccine was administered.
- A current Certificate of Child Health Examination form, specifying the date the MCV was administered.
- A Certificate of Religious Exemption, signed by a healthcare provider, if parents or legal guardians object for religious reasons to their child being immunized.

Breakfast and Lunch Provided for All Students Next School Year

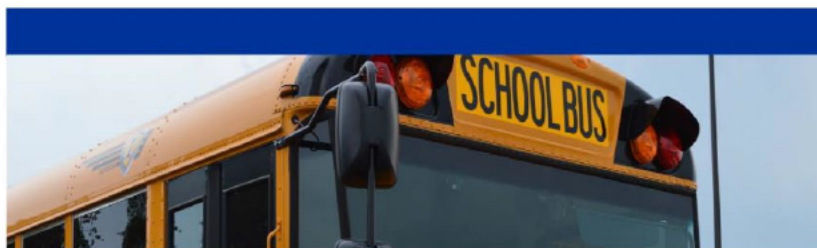

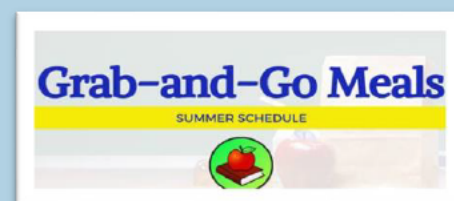
Grab-and-Go Meals Summer Schedule

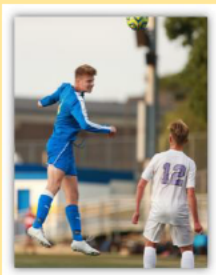
