Warren Connection: Nearing the End of the School Year

April 29, 2021





At its April 27, 2021 meeting, the Board of Education officially accepted the results of the April 6 election, which fell short of being approved by a majority of voters in District 121. The referendum question was placed on the ballot to allow the community to weigh in on possible additional revenue through an increase to the district's limiting rate.

We know that our financial challenges related to maintaining our current programs will not go away. We will leave the information on the Referendum page on the district website, so that community members can review the context and projected reductions in programming without additional revenue.

We look forward to continuing to engage with the community on these issues in the near future. WTHS is appreciative for the conversations we have been able to have with our community regarding the future of WTHS and the students we serve.

Board of Education Election Results

At the April 27 meeting, the Board of Education conducted an organizational meeting to officially declare the results of the April 6, 2021 School Board Election. The Lake County Clerk canvassed the votes following the April 6 consolidated election, and the Abstract of Votes was certified April 22.

The following candidates were elected to the Warren Township High School Board of Education for four-year terms: John R. Anderson, Natalia Alvarez Martinez, Katherine Blair, and Paul Schulz.

After taking the Oath of Office, the Board elected officers for the next two years. The Board officers are Mr. Schulz as President, Mr. Anderson as Vice President, and Ms. Beals as Secretary.

In-Person Meetings

Toward the conclusion of the meeting, the Board also rescinded the temporary policy 2:23-TR, Temporary Rules for Public Participation at School Board Meetings During COVID-19 Emergency. This action returns our Board of Education meetings to (generally) in-person status for participation by Board members and the community.



The district will continue to make efforts, however, to try and live-stream regular Board of Education meetings for the community to view.

Robyn Kubik Named Warren Township High School's Gurnee Teacher of the Year

Social Studies teacher selected by her colleagues for award from the Village of Gurnee

Social Studies teacher Robyn Kubik has been voted by her colleagues as Warren Township High School's 2020-2021 Gurnee Teacher of the Year.

Each school year, the Village of Gurnee recognizes three Gurnee teachers, including one from Warren Township High School District 121, Gurnee School District 56, and Woodland School District 50. The Gurnee Teacher of the Year receives a \$1,000 honorarium.



Kubik has served in education for 16 years, teaching at Warren Township High School for the last 14 years. She loves teaching because the classroom offers a unique work environment.

"I have been fortunate to spend the majority of my time at Warren teaching Psychology," said Kubik. "It is a course that I believe every student who takes it will benefit from. Psychology allows students to learn about themselves, how their brain works and how and why they act certain ways. The everyday connections that students can make to our course is infinite."

Kubik says some of her best teaching moments have happened after students leave both the classroom and the walls of Warren. Students will reach out and express what they remember learning in class and how it has impacted them in everyday life. Kubik believes there is no greater gift as an educator than to experience those full-circle moments.

"For 14 years, Robyn Kubik has been an incredibly powerful social studies teacher for Warren Township High School. She commits endless hours of preparation to ensure her students always have the tools they need for success in her psychology classes," said Dr. John Ahlgrim, Warren Township High School District 121 Superintendent. "Students benefit greatly from Robyn's positive outlook, energy and enthusiasm in the classroom. Robyn's commitment to continuous improvement for her courses and instructional practices are exemplary for our WTHS community. We are so proud to help recognize her as our Gurnee Teacher of the Year."

"I also really enjoy sharing the concept of Positive Psychology with students, helping them focusing on what is going RIGHT in their lives," Kubik said. "When we change our thought pattern, we can change so much else. The mind is our most powerful tool and resource."

Kubik holds a bachelor's degree from Illinois State University and has two master's degrees: one from Roosevelt University in Teaching for Secondary Education and one from Concordia University in Psychology.




