District 121 is excited to be able to issue a Chromebook to every student. This is the fifth year of our one-to-one Chromebook program. Chromebooks will be distributed to all incoming freshmen and transfer students new to the district during registration on July 30, July 31 and August 1, as well as during late registration on August 7. If a returning student has a

Chromebook that was damaged over the summer, or has a Chromebook that is not functioning properly, they should bring their Chromebook to the Tech Academy+ location at their respective campus when school resumes.



Students at the Almond Campus can bring their Chromebook to Room 109. Students at O'Plaine can bring their Chromebook to Room 250.



#### **State Testing**

Once again this school year, all Freshmen will take the PSAT-9, all Sophomores will take the PSAT-10, and all Juniors will take the SAT. The SAT will continue to be a graduation requirement for all of our students. The PSAT-9 and PSAT-10 provide students with an opportunity to monitor their progress towards being ready for the SAT. All three of these assessments will be administered in April. There will be additional communications regarding these assessments throughout the year. #### **2019 PSAT**

Junior students will have the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT this October. Registration for the PSAT/NMSQT will begin when school resumes in August. This year, the PSAT/NMSQT will be on Wednesday, October 16<sup>th</sup>. The cost to take this test will be \$20.

## Meningococcal Vaccination Reminder for ALL SENIORS

Effective January 1, 2015, all students entering the sixth and 12<sup>th</sup> grades are required to get the meningococcal vaccination. Students without adequate proof of vaccination will be subject to exclusion from school.

For families that cannot schedule an appointment to get their student immunized prior to the start of the school year Warren has partnered with Jewel-Osco to offer the vaccination during our walk-in registration process. Jewel-Osco will be providing specially trained pharmacists who will offer the meningococcal conjugate (MCV4) vaccine at the Almond Campus during registration. Jewel-Osco will handle all billing and payment on site. Students/parents can pay with cash, credit, or check. Jewel-Osco has the ability to bill a variety of insurance plans.

## **Freshman Physicals**

Please make sure physicals have been submitted to the health office at O'Plaine or bring one with you to registration. Students without a physical on the first day of school will be subject to exclusion from school.

## **Student Assistance Programming**

Our Social Workers will continue to promote healthy choices with a theme for each quarter of the school year. Our first quarter topic is Substance Abuse Awareness. Welcome back to school! The Warren Township Student Service Department strives to support students and parents with direct services that enhance their experience at WTHS through support for academic, social and emotional growth.

Our Student Service teams, see link below, are ready to continue to support students when they arrive. Our counselors will be available at registration if you have any last minute concerns about school or courses. In addition, once the year begins, please take advantage of the resources and services our counselors, social workers, psychologists and deans provide. We are happy to help students that are facing difficult decisions, struggling to acclimate to the building, struggling academically or socially, or providing resources to help start post high school planning. ## Registration

**Step 1:** You received an email in May with instructions on completing the online pre-registration process for your student(s).

- Update Student Information: The emailed instructions described how to log into the
  online pre-registration site so that you could update your student's demographic
  information, electronically sign for the Student-Parent Handbook and access any other
  necessary forms that require an electronic signature, as well as pay registration fees. If
  you haven't already done so, you are able to access the online registration process
  through the parent portal in PowerSchool.
- Log into your PowerSchool parent account using your parent username and password. The registration portal link, 2019-2020 Online Registration, will be on the bottom left-hand side of the screen. If you cannot remember your PowerSchool parent username or password, click on "Having trouble signing in?" on the PowerSchool login screen and follow the instructions. You will not be able to access PowerSchool Registration through the mobile app.
- A limited number of computers will be available during walk-in registration. To save time during walk-in registration, we strongly encourage completing the online pre-registration process prior to arriving at walk-in registration.
- After updating demographic information, electronically signing for the Student-Parent Handbook and any other necessary forms that require an electronic signature, a fee payment screen will be available.

It is required that you select one of three options to pay registration fee:

1) Credit Card, 2) Electronic Check or 3) Cash/Check

- Selecting credit card or electronic check will allow you to pay the registration fee immediately through the online registration site.
- Selecting Cash/Check allows you to pay the registration fee at a later time. If you
  select the Cash/Check option, you must complete payment through the <u>online fee</u>
  <u>payment site</u>. Your last opportunity to pay all fees will be during walk-in registration
  by visiting the lines at the cashier stations.

**Step 2:** July 30, July 31 and August 1, 2019, complete the walk-in registration and proof of residency process.

Attend walk-in registration at your 2019-20 campus of attendance: You will need to
provide <u>proof of residency</u>. Students can take their yearbook/ID photo, pick up their
schedule, bus route, locker assignment, and Chromebook/textbooks and parking
permits (if applicable). All <u>medical forms</u> you may need to complete may also be
turned in at this time. Your registration is not finished until you complete the walk-in
process.


