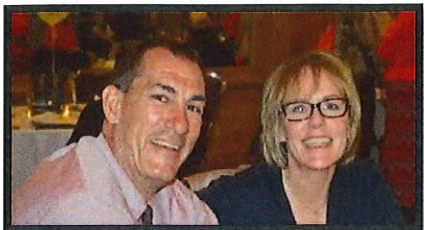

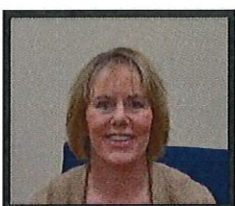
## Board of Education News

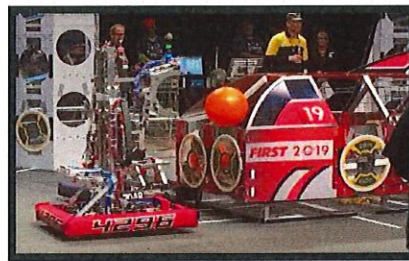


### Trident Robotics Team qualifies for World Championship competition on April 24-27, 2019

Trident team has won the Seven Rivers Regional Event! We were in an alliance with Team 111 – Wildstang and Team 2826 – Wave Robotics. We went undefeated through the playoffs and secured the regional victory by winning the first two of three matches in the finals!



This win has qualified us for the World Championships in Detroit, Michigan at the Cobo Center, April 24<sup>th</sup> through the April 27<sup>th</sup>.



This is an incredible achievement by the team members, mentors and parents. The gracious donations and sponsorship money made it possible for us to redesign our robot between our two competitions, which led to an incredibly efficient robot. We were also able to take home the Team Spirit Award at the Midwest Regional and the Quality Award Sponsored by Motorola Solutions Foundation at the La Crosse regional.

The Quality Award is incredibly special as the award is given to a team that "celebrates machine robustness in concept and fabrication." The guidelines are below:

- The entire team demonstrates robustness and quality: workmanship, welds, joints, wiring, paint, pit area, tools, control panel, cart, etc.
- The machine can withstand the rigors of competition – maintaining functionality, including the use of designed-in redundancy, fail-safety etc. that may mitigate failures in competition to gain other advantages (e.g. weight).
- Workmanship is valued and planned in both the machine and support equipment.
- Building the machine contributes to the team's success in FIRST – not just in performance on the field of competition.
- Execution is superb; the machine was built with a detailed plan in mind.

The team members worked incredibly hard to design and manufacture essentially three robots (one of them being a complete redesign). This is our first Technical award we have ever received.

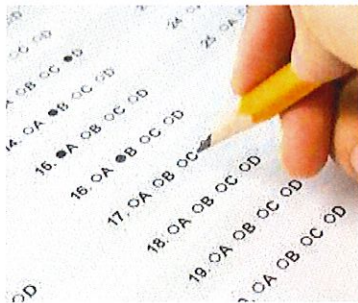

As a reminder, at the end of the school year, graduating seniors will be able to keep their Chromebook as long as all registration fees have been paid.

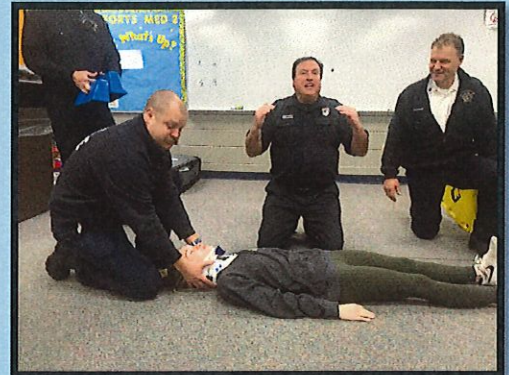
Seniors are still required to attend Chromebook/Textbook return during the last week they are in attendance.

## News from Business Services and Operations

### Warren receives energy incentives from ComEd *Smart Ideas Program* and Trane

At the April 9, 2019 meeting, the Board of Education received over \$200,000 in energy incentives from ComEd *Smart Ideas Program* and Trane for our projects at both buildings.

The project at the Almond campus consisted of the Ice Storage plant, which helps reduce the overall all need for air-conditioning and is a state of the art system which will keep the building cool during the summers much more efficiently than just air-conditioning alone.

The project at the O'Plaine campus consisted of a new building automation system and new controls that will ensure that the building will run extremely efficient and can be controlled remotely.

Both projects are state of the art and helping Warren to remain green and at the same time save \$40,000 a year at each campus in building efficiencies through the use of less natural resources.

### Facility Projects

- The Almond Campus tennis courts and parking lot improvements bids were approved and work will begin the first week of May. The courts and parking lots should be completed in August 2019.
- The O'Plaine Campus hot water domestic boiler projects are underway. The first hot water heater is in place and the second one should be completed by mid-April.
- The O'Plaine boiler project has been started and the major replacement work will not take place until after the heating season is over, which is typically in May. There are three boilers at the warehouse ready for installation.

### Financial Update for FY2019

The 2019 fiscal budget needs to be amended to reflect the sale of the working cash bonds earlier in the year and also reflect the expenditures that were used for capital projects between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019. These projects included: school safety upgrades, Almond Campus tennis courts, Almond Campus parking lot restriping and sealing, hot water domestic boilers and boilers at the O'Plaine campus.



### Almond Campus Solar Project

Over the last month, the Board of Education continued on an extensive process to review and plan of implementation of a solar project in District 121.

The Board hosted an Alternative Energy/Solar Committee meeting to review some of the final details related to the implementation of a Solar Project on the south end of our Almond Campus along Stearns School Road. The committee meeting, which was held on April 3, was focused on reviewing the finalized scope of the project along with the costs related to installation.

This proposal was brought forth to the Board at our April 9 Board meeting where the final scope and financials were reviewed and discussed thoroughly. The Board passed the action associated with this approval and preparation of the property and installation is expected to occur over the next several months.

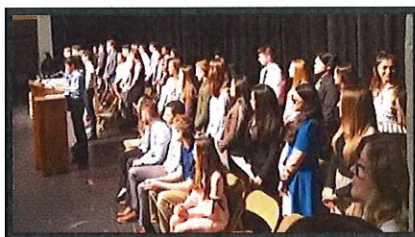

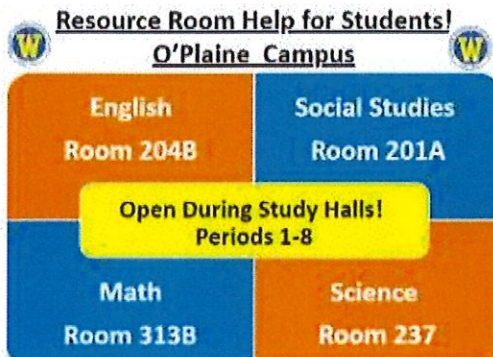
## Principal's Corner at the O'Plaine Campus

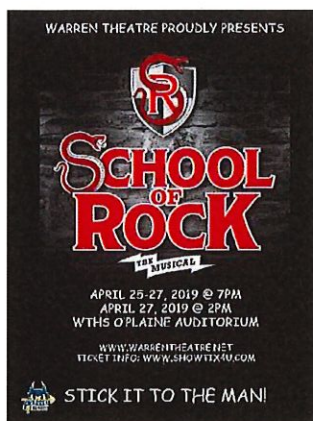
